Reporting to the President, I served as the college’s chief academic and student affairs officer, providing executive leadership for instruction, student success, and institutional effectiveness. I oversaw academic programs, curriculum, assessment, faculty development, enrollment management, and student services. As our Accreditation Liaison Officer, I was responsible for compliance, institutional reporting, continuous improvement, and maintaining our accreditation.

Key Accomplishments:

- Spearheaded reversing a 5 year enrollment decline by launching targeted initiatives such as multi-quarter registration for students.
- Negotiated three successful collective bargaining as the administrative lead with the local faculty union.
- Collaborated with the Vice President for Inclusion, Community and Access creating a learning gaps recovery program for local high school students utilizing a \$200,000 grant City of Kenmore.
- As chair of the SBCTC Instructional Commission Transfer Committee, and Co-chair of the Joint Transfer Council (a state-wide collective of 3 higher educational sectors and 4 state agencies), facilitated the process for modifying the state-wide transfer degree to improve student outcomes by collaborating with three higher education sectors and four state agencies.
- Facilitated launching innovative academic programs including American Indian Studies and a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science.

- Collaborated with University of Washington Bothell executive leadership planning, designing, financing, and building an innovative and sustainable shared STEM building.

- Facilitated the creation and implementation of a strategic enrollment management plan and established a weekly “Enrollment Huddle” collaborative that successfully decrease non-registered students from 800 to 200 within 2 months.
- Reconstructed the student affairs division focused on enhancing student success by reorganizing key staff into new teams, creating new opportunities for collaboration with partners, improving campus-wide communication, and reimagining our service mindset.
- Secured multiple grants advancing student success including the *Guided Pathways Grant*, Oregon Association of Community Colleges, Student Success Center, (2018, \$25,000), AVON Foundation, *Bystander Invention Program* (2014-2015, \$5,000) and the National Society for Student Leadership and Success (2014-2015, \$2,800).
